Please clarify.</p>	<p>If in situation when foreign company is supplier, customs clearance procedure and payments (including custom duties and other import taxes) are under Purchaser responsibility. Therefore, Purchaser prepares all documentation. It is recommended that non-resident supplier does not send the goods to Serbia until they obtain the consent from Purchaser which says that Purchaser prepared the documentation so that the goods would not be detained at customs. After customs clearance, the supplier proceeds the transport to the delivery place.</p>
